#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION: Mark 6:7-13**

Today's gospel is Mark's version of Jesus sending His disciples out to spread His message more widely. The disciples would walk to a village and speak in a public forum like the village square and present the spirituality of Jesus as a way to God through a fulfilling life. We do well to remember that Jesus was not offering something suspiciously radical but was presenting a change of emphasis in the way average Palestinian Jews might grow to wholeness in the Mosaic tradition.

Making connection with people the disciples would be ambassadors of encouragement with the ability to soothe the troubled, cast out demons and even heal the sick. Village people who responded positively to the words of the itinerant disciples might well offer hospitality for a night or two. Jesus encourages His supporters to accept graciously and stay in the one house for the length of their time in that village. He is obviously urging them not to follow the unwise practice of looking for a better offer.

Jesus also deals with the possibility that the disciples and their message of change might not be accepted in any given place. In which case they should leave and shake the dust of that place from their sandals. Scholars generally admit the meaning here is not clear. When they returned home from a gentile place Jewish travellers customarily shook off the dust of that place. Gentile ground was considered to be unholy. It may simply be a gesture of not wanting to have anything more to do with the place that rejects them.

There is a clear view of the practical Jesus in this reading. We see His recommendations to His people cautioning them to not be pushy, not to assume village folk are ignorant, to respect those who offer hospitality and to move on smartly if they are made unwelcome or if their words are rejected. Jesus presents the same practical approach elsewhere when He urges His disciples to avoid beating themselves up if they are rejected. He uses the metaphor of casting pearls before swine who will fail to appreciate what is on offer and trample it underfoot. In other words, if you see your message is being rejected wholesale, then pack up and move on. Don't shout into a raging headwind.

How often do we beat ourselves up over a mistake or a misspoken word? It's sometimes hard to accept our weaknesses and failings and yet there is no profit in agonising without working toward healing. It takes graciousness towards self and others to move on and learn from episodes of skinned knees.


