From Sunday 7 – Saturday 13 September 2025, we come together to recognise Queensland Child Protection Week – a time to celebrate our shared responsibility in creating safe, supportive, and nurturing environments for children and young people.

Keeping children safe from harm is a responsibility we all share. When communities work together, children grow up feeling valued, protected, and heard.

Children and young people often show great courage when they share their experiences. Listening to them – and believing them – is one of the most powerful ways we can protect them. By responding with care, respect, and action, we send a strong message that their voices matter. If you believe a child is in immediate danger or a lifethreatening situation, call Triple Zero (000).

If you are concerned that a child in Queensland may be experiencing harm, is at risk of harm, or may be neglected, you can:

- . During business hours contact your nearest Child Safety Regional Intake Service.
- . After hours call the Child Safety After Hours Service Centre on 1800 177 135 (available 24/7).

Together, we can create a Queensland where every child is safe, supported, and able to thrive.

Protecting children is everyone's business.

GOSPEL REFLECTION: John 3:13-17

So, today is dedicated to the importance of what the cross represents for the followers of Jesus. In time, the cross became the badge of the Jesus people because it stood for the enormous gift of Himself that Jesus made for our sake. As St Paul put it, He humbled Himself and submitted Himself to death on a cross.

It is worth bearing in mind that the cross in the gospel of John is a sign of triumph over death, whereas in the three Synoptic Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke it is presented as a tragedy. John doesn't quote Jesus crying out, 'My God, My God why have You abandoned Me?' because he wants to focus on Jesus' gift of Himself as sacrifice. John parallels this self-sacrifice with the Paschal Lamb that was slaughtered by the Israelites in Egypt as food for their escape to freedom under the leadership of Moses.

The key issue, though, in all four gospels is that Jesus' death on the cross is not the end. The resurrection of Jesus is His ultimate victory over death and so the climax of each gospel is Christ Risen. He was lifted up on the cross for our salvation and then was raised up from the tomb in ultimate triumph over death.

Our partnership with Jesus is a journey to wholeness where we become part of the realm of God. After all, He said, if you take My yoke upon you, that is, if you do it My way we will be in partnership, and you will find deep peace and wholeness in your inmost being, knowing that you are on the right track (Matthew 11:29-30, My paraphrase).
