ARCHBISHOP SHANE HAS A MESSAGE FOR YOU:

I have now been the Archbishop for one month and I have been deeply moved by the warmth of the welcome I have received. GOSPEL REFLECTION: Luke 18:1-8

Again we see Jesus using His favourite method of teaching – telling a story. Everyone loves a story and a good yarn spinner has the ability to engage and convince an audience. In this parable the judge in a town was reluctant to address the case of a widow who had been victimised and was insisting on justice. Widows, orphans and foreigners made up the usual trilogy of those who were vulnerable in society. Widows did not automatically inherit the estate of a deceased husband even though arrangements were generally made for her ongoing upkeep. They faced life well behind the 8-ball.

As Jesus tells it, the judge had no regard for the basic commandment to revere God and respect other human beings. This tells us that the judge is not inclined to concern himself with the petition of an insignificant woman in the town. So he ignores her pleas for justice.

God is a righteous Judge and will not be biased in favour of the disadvantaged but will distribute justice evenly and measure out punishment to the wicked who prey on the needy.

Jesus is not saying that our prayer should consist of badgering God until we get what we want. Rather, our takeaway from this parable is, God is compassionate, patient and eager to help us, and, we should be alert to what it takes to sign on to the reign of God. Our interior life and prayer keep us in touch with the Divine. We are involved with God when we see Christ in others and take the initiative to reach out to those who need a lift.
