GOSSPEL REFLECTION: Mark 9:30-37

This is the second of the passion predictions in Mark and it reinforces the fact that the suffering and brutal death of Jesus are more noticeably in focus in the second half of this Gospel. It is also clear that Jesus' teaching is no longer addressed to the crowds but more particularly to His band of followers.

The message of Jesus here is that respect for all is the mark of His followers. By taking a child and setting him in view of everybody and then putting His arm around him, Jesus is dramatizing a parable. He is acting out the respect and concern one should have for the insignificant and the powerless in society. It also happens that the Aramaic word talya can mean both child and servant. The implication of this little tableau for the disciples is that instead of bothering about their own position they should be more concerned for the weakest and most vulnerable in their society.

Jesus is making a radical counter-cultural statement to the effect that anyone who welcomes the lowest in society in His name is, in effect, welcoming *Him*. The power of His proposal lies in the fact that it goes against normal social practice in that worldview to warmly welcome a child or a servant. In both Aramaic and Mark's Greek the verb translated in some versions as 'welcome' means to receive, in the sense of taking an active step to bring a person into the embrace of friendship, warmth and glad acceptance. This cannot be done in a cavalier or passive way but must be a conscious act of generosity.

Jesus is inviting us into a transformational presence that involves seeing beyond the surface of a person or situation. This is an intuitive approach to relationships where we forego snap judgements and take time to read the energy of a situation, a person's body language, possibilities. There are times when we move past a situation and review how we dealt with it. Did we intuit possibilities? Did I consider what might have lain beneath the surface?


