

GOSPEL REFLECTION: Matthew 4:12-23

Matthew reveals the practical side of Jesus. Convinced that He had a calling to respond to and a mission to carry out He cleared out of Judea to avoid arrest on account of His association with John. He settled in Capernaum, a fishing town on the northern shore of the Sea of Galilee. It seems that Capernaum was His base for around six months. His message was different from that of John based on His vision of the reign of God and what it takes to belong to it. For Matthew and the early disciples, Jesus is the light who will lift the darkness, and so Matthew has no problem quoting First Isaiah's allusion to the ideal leader sent by God to rescue the people.

One powerful insight emphasised by Matthew is that Jesus realises His task cannot be carried out alone. He is mature and practical enough to see that He needs help and begins to gather Himself people who can share the mission with Him and be companions in this enterprise. Some of these disciples are offered an invitation, others are impressed by this man to the point of asking to join with Him.

Matthew ends this scene with a sweeping generalisation depicting Jesus wandering 'the whole' of Galilee teaching in the synagogues and proclaiming the kind of world that could be, if people dedicated themselves to living by the values of God, putting love and compassion above all other interests and goals. He adds that Jesus went about curing all kinds of sickness and disease, which implies that He could back up all His teaching with deeds that showed how Divine power was working through Him. This automatically puts Jesus in the company of the prophets adding authority to His words. – Laurie Woods

A MESSAGE FROM THE REGIONAL TRIBUNAL:

It is essential at the beginning of any journey with people preparing either for marriage or to become Catholic that their marital situation is sensitively investigated. As early as possible, anyone with a prior marriage/divorce should be encouraged to make contact with the Regional Tribunal so that we can examine their situation and apply the relevant process to assist them, and hopefully declare them to be free to marry.

Please remember that the Catholic Church recognises many non-Catholic marriages as being presumed valid. So even if the previous marriage involved two non-Catholics and was celebrated outside the Catholic Church, the individual now wishing to re-marry in the Catholic Church will need a Tribunal process of some sort.

Another reminder the Tribunal offices have now moved to the St Columba's precinct at Wilston. The street address is 23 Lovedale Street, Wilston, and the Tribunal's entry is via the white gate that faces the O'Shea Centre carpark. Walk in visitors are always welcome Monday to Friday, best done between 9:00 am and 3:30 pm.
