

GOSPEL REFLECTION: Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23

The gospel today is in two parts and tells the story of the flight into Egypt. It omits the paragraph about Herod's killing of young male children, a text read three days after Christmas on the feast of the Holy Innocents. If it is historical, this would have been a relatively small-scale event in the vicinity of Bethlehem. Herod may have died just a few months later.

The story is clearly symbolic in Matthew's gospel. He is keen to show how the Scriptures were being fulfilled. Coming out of Egypt constitutes a new Exodus and a new covenant established in Jesus. This is the purpose of Matthew's narrative.

The chronology of the Lectionary is a little confusing because the feast of the Holy Family is celebrated a week before the Epiphany when we hear the basic story of the wise men coming from the East.

Joseph shows himself to be an admirable father, taking every care to protect Mary and Jesus and keep them safe. He was also radically open to the prompting of the Holy Spirit – three times in this short text, Joseph receives divine messages in a dream and acts on them.

NEWS FROM THE OFFICE FOR SAFEGUARDING SERVICES:

The Archdiocese of Brisbane has achieved a 96% compliance rating against the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards following a comprehensive independent audit conducted by Australian Catholic Safeguarding Ltd (ACSL).

For the first time, Centacare Services, Catholic Early EdCare, Brisbane Catholic Education schools and Archdiocesan Ministries participated in the audit process, together with a sample of 15 parishes. Their inclusion provided the comprehensive view of safeguarding practice across the breadth of the Archdiocese's parishes, ministries and services to date.

This strong result affirms the Archdiocese's ongoing commitment to building safe, respectful, and accountable environments for children and vulnerable people across all ministries.

Archbishop Shane Mackinlay welcomed the findings, noting that safeguarding was fundamental to the Church's mission.

"This result reflects the dedication of our clergy, staff, and volunteers who work each day to ensure our parishes, ministries, and services are places of safety, respect and trust," Archbishop Mackinlay said.

"We remain committed to ongoing improvement and accountability and to fostering a culture where the dignity of every person is upheld."


