



SACRAMENT OF FIRST HOLY COMMUNION 2024:

Parent Info Session – on Thursday, 3rd of October at 3:30 pm in the church – Fr Ladu and Diane Johnson (APRE), St Paul's Primary School, to talk through First Holy Communion Program and the expectations of parental/carer support during the program.

GOSSPEL REFLECTION: Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

The practical social teaching in this passage reminds the disciples and us that the followers of Jesus should hold to a superior ethical standard in human relationships. Jesus is offering a parallel argument to the one we saw coming from Moses in the first reading. If someone does a service in the name of Christ then who can question its authenticity? Goodness and integrity do not depend on our belonging to the right club. The motivation behind a good deed determines its value.

The 'little ones' may well refer to the previous incident when Jesus held a child in His arms and declared that anyone who received a child in His name receives Himself and the God who sent Him. But the 'little ones' also applies to the decent and upright people in society and particularly to the insignificant and powerless who can be easily downtrodden. Then Jesus utters what is arguably His most damning statement about people who lead others astray and cause them to fall.

Mark uses the Greek word skandalon, which is usually translated as a stumbling block. We get our English word scandal from the Greek. But Jesus is not so much talking about scandal, as we understand it; He is talking about putting an obstacle in front of an innocent person which causes them to trip and fall over. In other words, if you influence somebody to the extent of damaging their lives then you might as well be drowned in the sea with a heavy weight around your neck. This is serious stuff. It is saying that an unrepentant person guilty of corrupting a blameless individual, particularly a child, deserves to be cast out of sight, into oblivion, forgotten about.

Today's passage concludes with Jesus' remarks about the divine justice people can expect if they effectively rebel against God by committing evil acts in word or deed. When He talks about 'entering into life' beyond death maimed or incomplete we can see the intention of His metaphor. The point is, the wholeness of an individual does not depend on physical entirety but on spiritual completeness.


